
GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATION California State Senator Tony Strickland Addresses Chamber's Governmental Relations Committee

At the July Governmental Relations Committee meeting, Senator Tony Strickland provided the latest update on state government to a capacity crowd. He opened his remarks stating, "It is my privilege to be the Chamber's voice in Sacramento."

The Senator provided information on the latest redistricting commis-

sion maps and the boundaries recently drawn. The final maps were released on July 28 and sent to the Department of Justice for review. Upon completion of that review, the maps returned to the commission members for the final vote on August 15.

While discussing the past budget session, Senator Strickland reported that this year's budget negotiations had changed dramatically because fee increases need a two-thirds vote due to a recent ballot initiative. Key concerns include pension reform, as there is no way to sustain current levels unless major changes occur. Combining or eliminating some state offices and commissions should also be a top priority for easing the budget deficit. He also recommended a spending gap be put in place and spending limits be prioritized and reduced.

The senator reported that California has the second highest unemployment rate in the nation. He strongly supports both parties cooperating to improve the economy and to assist businesses-not only those currently in California, but those businesses that might be considering a move from another state. Strickland stated, "California's best days are ahead, but we all need to work together."

New Attorney Affinity Program Connects Chamber Members with Local Attorneys

A novel and unique program between the Ventura County Lawyer Referral and Information Service (LRIS) and the Greater Conejo Valley Chamber of Commerce brings new opportunities to local attorneys and local businesses. In light of the changing economy, Steven Lehat spearheaded this simulating program to create a bridge between the needs of local business owners and to generate attorney referrals. The program provides Chamber members with referrals to local attorneys through its Affinity Program.

Many business owners "win win" for both sides, the Affinity Program allows business owners to develop relationships with attorneys so they will be comfortable seeking guidance throughout the growth of their business. Attorneys will have the ability to mix and mingle with Chamber members at such monthly events as Jump Start Networking Breakfasts, Lunch and Learn seminars, Networking at Night Mixers and other Chamber events. Lehat is the driving force behind the Affinity Program. Since the early 90s, Lehat has created many other innova-

tive programs between referral services and chambers of commerce across the United States. He developed a successful practice in the Newport Beach area specializing in intellectual property, securities and international trade. Recently, Lehat opened an office in Ventura County. Looking to contribute to the local legal community, Lehat joined the LRIS board in December 2010. The Chamber's professionalism, commitment to its members, and their demographics motivated Lehat to pioneer the
